### LENT

"Oh, no, not again! It's almost time for LENT. How depressing. All those sermons about penitence and fasting. I wish we could hurry up and get to Easter. "

Have you been having this conversation in your head, or have you heard someone else saying something like it out loud? Are you one of those people who dread the season of Lent? You may be wondering why we even need Lent anymore.

If I may paraphrase Charlie Brown, *"Isn't there anyone who knows what Lent is all about?"*

And, as Linus might say in reply, *"Sure, Charlie Brown. I can tell you what Lent is all about?"*

Create in me a clean heart, O God, \*  
and renew a right spirit within me.  
Cast me not away from your presence \*  
and take not your holy Spirit from me.  
Give me the joy of your saving help again \*  
and sustain me with your bountiful Spirit.

Those words are from Psalm 51, and they tell us precisely what Lent is about. It is about changing the direction of our life.

We all look forward to the glorious Easter message of resurrection, forgiveness, hope, light, and glory. But, in order to experience the real joy of Easter, to appreciate the true value of what Christ has done for us, we first must let go of the things that are getting in the way of God's redeeming love. Lent is the time each year when we are given an opportunity to focus on our spiritual health, to clean out the clutter of worldly temptations, the cobwebs of remorse, and the dust and dirt of wrong doings and guilt.

The Church uses the word "repentance" to describe the process of spiritual house-cleaning. Unfortunately, the word has acquired a bad reputation, but repentance literally means to "change one's mind." It implies that whenever we are headed in the wrong direction, we have a chance to turn around and go the right way, *God's way*. We are not lost, just temporarily off course. What a hopeful thought!

Repentance is more than just feeling remorse. The goal is not to spend the forty days of Lent feeling miserable. The point is not to just look backward. Yes, we should honestly and fully acknowledge the ways we have failed God and each other and ourselves. But then we are called to hand all those things over to God, asking Him in His mercy to take away the burden of sin we are carrying, relying on His loving-kindness and great compassion to get us turned around and headed in the right direction.

The Good News is, we know He will, because that is the message and promise of Easter:

Purge me from my sin, and I shall be pure; \*  
wash me, and I shall be clean indeed.

Then, as once again we greet the Resurrected Jesus, "Welcome happy morning age to age shall sing!"

**Approval of the Vestry Meeting Minutes, December 14<sup>th</sup>, 2021**

The December 14<sup>th</sup>, 2021 minutes were approved on a motion by J. Russom and seconded by M. Moran. The motion was unanimously approved by the vestry.

**Sr. Warden's Report** –J. Chenot

First, I would like to wish everyone a Happy New Year. Secondly, I would like to thank everyone on the Vestry and those who supported and prayed for us last year during many challenging times. It has been heartwarming to see our congregation, church guilds; choir, staff show up helping in any way to support one other at St. Peters.

Our December and Advent was a joyous time for everyone who were able to attend the services. The Sunday school pageant, Lessons & Carols, Hanging of the Greens with a luncheon as we prepared for Christmas Eve and Christmas. When Christmas Eve arrived, we were able to have two wonderful services that were well attended. The Christmas music and Choir was phenomenal – thank you all.

January 30<sup>th</sup> will be our annual meeting after the 10:30 service. Again, we would like to thank Nancy Creagan for all her services on the vestry as well as her continued work as chair on the Flower Guild. The vestry has nominated Sharon DeBonis for election to fill Nancy's seat. I also received a resignation/"retirement" letter from Jack Ratzel. We will continue to see Jack on Sunday's, but he will now again enjoy the services with everyone in the congregation. Thank you so much Jack for all your time, commitment and service you have given to St. Peter's over the many years including serving on the Vestry. Thank you again.

Catherine Schunk also reached out to me regarding the Gloria frontal. The frontal has been in need of repair for some time now and asked for some guidance moving forward with restoration. I let her know to move forward and get a quote on repairing the frontal so we can move forward and get it repaired following Easter. Thank you, Cathy.

Navigating the supply ministers each week, forwarding information to the ministers as well as the LEMs needed for each week's Sunday service has been a bit challenging. In some cases we don't have the information as to who and what type of service we may perform in an upcoming Sunday service too one or two days prior. Compiling the leaflets, proper readings, inserts, music at a last minute notice would not be possible if it was not for Ruth and Janice's tedious work in the office. Thank you both.

I am attempting to send a letter out to the congregation prior to the annual meeting updating them on a few items. This will also give me an opportunity to acknowledge so many who were so instrumental keeping St. Peter's open last year for those who were ready to return to worship each Sunday. Please pray I don't leave anyone out – everyone has been so helpful, and it has been wonderful to see everyone work together – the Holy Spirit is at work.

**Sunday Attendance** - The Average Sunday Attendance is 46.0.

**Finance** – G. Scala - Treasurer's Report

George reviewed the December Treasurer's Report. Offerings for the month of December were \$33,251. Year-to-date offerings were \$202,753. This compares to \$201,703 for 2020.

Investment accounts saw increases for the month. Merrill Lynch was up 2.35% for the month and Key was up 2.38%. Year-to-date Merrill Lynch finished at +13.11% and Key finished at +13.35%. Expenses were \$162,374 under budget for the year, primarily due to the vacancies in our clergy positions.

Pledges are beginning to come in for 2022. The stewardship letter will be going out very soon.
