COVID Restrictions Lifted: Following the directives of the New York State Health Department, the Standing Committee of the Episcopal Diocese of Albany has lifted all diocesan restrictions related to COVID-19, and encouraged parishes to begin gradually returning to normal worship routines. This is a wonderful and encouraging development, for which we give thanks to God. In the interests of safety and health, especially for the most vulnerable among us, our return to normal worship will be gradual. At this time masks and 6 feet social distancing are no longer required, Communion will be received at the altar rail and the common cup will be offered, congregational singing of hymns is allowed, and child care for the 10:30AM service is offered. We are so thankful to God to be able to move in this direction. Please continue to pray for an end to the pandemic, and for the health and safety of all.

Angels in Training: On the 3rd Saturday of every month St. Peter's Church is committed to preparing take out meals and goody bags to the people at the St. Francis Mission Soup Kitchen (formerly known as Grace and Holy Innocents). The need is getting bigger each week. Shut-Ins: While Mtr. Christina and Fr. Paul are with us this summer, they are very interested in reaching out to those that are shut-in to see if they would like a visit. If you know of anyone that is shut-in, please contact Ruth in the church office or contact either priest directly.

Food Donations: In continuing to serve and meet the needs of the daily "walk-ins" at our door here at St. Peter's, we are requesting donations of pre-packaged food and drinks that we can distribute to them. These people have come to rely on our clergy who have provided them with funds to purchase food. With our regular clergy gone and our supply clergy here in the office on a limited basis, we would like to be able to give these people some healthy and ready-to-eat food and a drink when they ask. Some examples of pre-packaged, <u>non-perishable</u> foods are: packaged cheese & crackers, packaged tuna, canned items such as beans, salmon, tuna, chicken, chili (anything that is ready to eat and has a pull top), vitamin waters, juice boxes, V-8 (small individual containers, **please no glass**). We are also accepting monetary donations and we will do the shopping for you. Please make your check payable to St. Peter's Church and note "walk-ins" on the memo line. We are also accepting the ordinary donations of non-perishable food items. These are usually dropped off in the back of the church, but may be brought into the church office during the week as well. We thank you for your support in helping those in need.
