True Confessions

"Let us confess our sins unto Almighty God." These familiar words call us to join in the prayer of Confession (Morning Prayer Rite I, BCP p. 41), to admit to ourselves and to God that we have done wrong and to ask for His mercy. The prayer of Confession has come down to the present day nearly unchanged from the first Book of Common Prayer in 1549, but its lyrical phrases still have the power to move us: "we have erred and strayed like lost sheep... we have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts..." However, because these words have become so familiar through many years of repetition, it is easy to forget what they truly mean. In today's Gospel, we have an example of a simple, spontaneous confession made by the younger son,

"I will get up and go to my father, and I will say to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me like one of your hired hands."" (Luke 15:18-19)

There are two important things to note about this confession. First, when the son says, "I will go to my father," it is a statement of faith. Before he even gets up to return, the son believes in his father's intrinsic goodness and mercy. That is the way you and I should approach God when we sin: "I will go to my Father." He is always waiting to forgive us, if only we will turn to Him again. Mercy is in God's very nature because God is love.

The second thing to note about the son's confession is that he acknowledges that he is unable to save himself: "I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me like one of your hired hands." When you and I confess our sins to God we also confess that we have no power to deliver ourselves from those sins. After all, if we had the power to change ourselves without God's help, Jesus would not have had to come. But Jesus *has* come and so we pray in hope and in faith,

But thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us, spare thou those who confess their faults, restore thou those who are penitent.

When you and I truly confess and repent, our sins are not only forgiven, but they are wiped out. That is God's mercy. That is God's love.

Thanks be to God!
