

St. Peter's Rectors who became Bishops



Right Reverend Horatio Potter

The first reactor from St. Peter's Church to become a bishop was Reverend Horatio Potter. Potter graduated from Union College in 1826, and after being ordained a deacon was ordained a priest in 1828. From 1828 to 1833 he was a Professor of Mathematics and Natural Sciences at Washington College. After accepting a call on May 11,1833 he was consecrated as rector of St. Peter's Church. There he gained the respect and regard of his parishioners. On Wednesday November 22, 1854 in Trinity Church in New York City he was consecrated as Bishop of the Diocese of New York. He Remained Bishop of New York performing most of his duties until three years and eight months before he died on January 2, 1887.

In 1860, Bishop Potter established St. Stephen's College at Annandale on Hudson, NY (later named Bard College). Although the idea of building a cathedral, to be named the Cathedral of St. John the Divine was formulated in 1828, no action was taken until 1872 when Potter's Diocesan Convention gave the idea its unanimous support. In spite of obtaining a charter and Bishop Potter being chairman of the Board of Trustees, building activity awaited the episcopate of Henry C. Potter (his nephew).

The Cathedral of St. John the Divine and the Cathedral Close represent the center of the Episcopal Diocese of New York. The complex consists of the Cathedral Church and six buildings that form the Close, including the Leake & Watts Orphan Asylum, Faith House, the Choir School, Synod House, the Deanery and the Bishop's House. At another location Potter also instituted the Community of St. Mary in 1865. This was the first religious community to be established since the days of the monasteries in England.

The Cathedral of St. John the Divine remains unfinished. Begun in 1892, there were several stylistic changes and work interruptions. Completion of the nave was delayed until 1941. A fire in 2019 led to a renovation in 2000 and a rededication in 2008. The cathedral remains one of the largest and most beautiful in the world.



Right Reverend William Croswell Doane

William Croswell Doane was born in Boston on March 2, 1832. After his ordination as a priest in 1856 he became involved in the Oxford Movement which sought to restore the richness of practice in the liturgy. He served in several parishes before he accepted a position as rector of St. Peter's Church in 1867.

From St. Peter's he was selected as Bishop of the newly created Albany Diocese in 1869. He was consecrated as the Bishop of Albany, at St Peter's Church on the Feast of Purification on February 2, 1869. He remained the Bishop of the Albany Diocese until his death in 1913.

Doane's primary concern as Bishop was the construction of the Cathedral of All Saints in Albany. The Cathedral plan was to be a complex to include a convent, cloister, hospital and school. The Saint Agnes School for Girls was established in 1870, the convent and hospital in 1874. In the late 19th century he founded the Boys' Choir School (now defunct) and the Cathedral Choir of Men and Boys (which is active today.) The cathedral was dedicated unfinished in 1888.

Thus both cathedrals were large cathedral complexes. Each was the center of its respective diocese. Both have been the center of special activities appropriate for their large size. And today both remain unfinished.

Last month we had our first search committee meeting which was very productive. We will have multiple meetings during the summer, but feel like we have started off in a positive direction.

As mentioned, supply ministers are scarce and harder to come by as many have left our diocese in the past year and continue to do so. Many churches have had to call Deacons in for supply, as we have had to do. We were very fortunate with such a short notice to have Deacon Richard Erickson from St. Paul's in Kinderhook the first Sunday in June. We had a Morning Prayer service with a small choir and the service was well attended. Deacon Rick loved our church and is looking forward to helping us in any capacity as we move forward with our search.

The Rectory is all set for the Hunters. They will be coming up late this Friday and will be ready for this coming Sunday Service. They will be here from this coming Sunday till the end of July. We hope everyone will begin coming back to church in person to support St. Peters, the Hunters and each other, as we work through this transitional period.

I want to thank those who have been in contact with me with their thoughts and suggestions as we move forward. Your phone calls and emails are very much appreciated. I want to thank Ruth Manss in advance for her support that will be needed in the office as we beginning our search. Finance – G. Scala - Treasurer's Report

Offerings for the month of May were \$23,922. Year-to-date offerings are \$79,499. This compares to \$88,612 at this time in May 2020.

Investment accounts were mixed for the month, Merrill Lynch was down -0.50% and Key was up +0.46%. Year-todate Merrill Lynch is up +7.18% and Key is up +6.54%. George reported that we continue to wait on Key to process the agreed upon distributions and put us on a permanent distribution schedule going forward at 5% per year. He will continue to monitor and discuss with Key going until resolved. Expenses are \$60,341 under budget through May. To date we remain at 38 pledges for a total pledge amount \$106,894.
