



Assisting the Priest/Deacon in setting the table for Holy Communion

Serving Wine as an element in Holy Communion.

Extinguishing the candles at the end of the service, Left to Right.

Serving as a Lay Eucharistic Minister is tremendously gratifying and one of the most rewarding embodiments on how to serve our God.


Community Out Reach

MINUTES FOR THE VESTRY MEETING ST. PETER'S PROTESTANT EPISCOPAL CHURCH October 12th, 2021

Approval of the Vestry Meeting Minutes, September 14th, 2021

The September 14th, 2021 minutes were approved on a motion by M. Lundberg and seconded by J. Russom. The motion was unanimously approved by the vestry.

Sr. Warden's Report —A few hours prior to our vestry meeting I was putting a few notes together, as I have done so many times in the past. My few short notes I intended to write down ended up to be a page and a half of notes of many accomplishments and many thank—you's to so many individuals. The list starting from the members on the Vestry, to our Office Staff, Ushers, Altar Guild, LEM's, our Choir, Su nday School and Nursery and all the Supply ministers and Deacons who have helped us in worship each Sunday. I wished in the report I could list everyone's name, but the list would have been quite long and I would be afraid to miss someone. The truth is everyone who has supported our Ve stry; the parishioner's that may not have a particular role in the day-to-day goings on in the church, but have been there in the pews each Sunday supporting all of us as we begin to move forward. The support has given me a tremendous love for each and every one of you, and shows everyone your love and commitment to St. Peter's.

It is so humbling when we have a guest minister or Deacon visit to preach on a Sunday, and then to ask if it would be possible to return. They comment on how lovely our church is, but what they find is how welcoming and hospitable our congregation is which wants them to return again. This just confirms to me we are all doing something right during our status, in search for a new Rector.

Next month on All Saints Day we will have two baptisms and two that will receive Holy Communion for the first time. With this said, a small class has been formed by our LEMS to teach those who will be receiving Holy Communion, the meaning of the service. We then look ahead to our pre-Thanksgiving Dinner on November 13th, where we hope many of you are able to come together and enjoy some great food and fellowship. We will again decorate our altar for Thanksgiving with food donations dropped off at the church, which will then later be donated to the local food pantry.

We are now trying to fill our calendar for supply priests for the Advent season. I have had many conversations with our guild members, as well as those in the parish, to give me a litmus test how we should move as Advent moves closer. Many have reported back, wanting us to bring back as many Christmas and Advent traditions as we are able. There are a few uncertainties regarding a few services and dates, but would rather work the details out and then report back to everyone at the November's meeting when things are more concrete. God has been very good to us and I am very confident his hand will steer us all through a meaningful and joyous Advent season.

Again, there where so many individuals I would have loved to thank personally in my report but felt it would not have been fair to so many who have helped in so many ways.

Sunday Attendance - The Average Sunday Service is 84.4.

<u>Finance</u> – In George's absence, he submitted a report reviewing the Treasurer's Reports for the month of September. Offerings for the month of September were \$16,340. Year-to-date offerings are \$123,309. This compares to \$143,454 at this time in 2020.

Investment accounts saw declines for the month. Merrill Lynch was down -3.68% for the month and Key was down -4.11%. Year-to-date Merrill Lynch is up +8.22% and Key is up +7.28%. Expenses are \$123,610 under budget through September, primarily due to the vacancies in our clergy positions.

To date we are at 39 pledges for a total pledge amount \$108,094.

<u>New Business</u> – There will be new LEM's starting their training in the next few weeks. John Davis, one of our LEM's, will be holding First Comunion classes for children who will make their First Communion on All Saints' Sunday. We will also be having 2 baptisms on All Saints' Sunday.

Adjournment - A motion to adjourn was made by F. Hershey and seconded by D. Spath, then was approved unanimously by the vestry.
