Eve of the Feast of St. Peter and St. Paul

Beloved of God,

I am writing to you on a glorious June morning, surrounded by books and half unpacked boxes — signs of a new journey that I'm looking forward to taking with all of you, trusting in the Holy Spirit to guide us.

First, a word of self-introduction for those of you I didn't get a chance to meet last summer: I'm Mtr. Christina Hunter. I'm clergy of the Albany Diocese, ordained deacon and priest in 2010 by the Rt. Rev. William H. Love after graduating from Trinity School for Ministry that same year. I co-founded the mission Oaks of Righteousness in Troy after graduating from seminary, and I served there for eight years. I also served for a year as long term supply/interim at St. John's Episcopal Church in Troy.

Since summer 2019, I've lived in South Carolina with my husband, Fr. Paul Hunter, and our two children, Martha (6) and Jonathan (4). Fr. Paul taught Latin, Greek, Classics and New Testament at Holy Trinity Classical Christian School in Beaufort, SC, while I spent three years at home caring for our growing kids. Our family is deeply grateful for our time in the South, but we quickly had a sense that it was a transition time for us and that God would call us to a new place of ministry in the coming years.

I am excited and grateful for my call to serve Jesus alongside all of you at St. Peter's Protestant Episcopal Church as priest in charge. I met many of you last summer when Fr. Paul and I served as supply clergy after Fr. Hartt's retirement, and I was struck by the richness of worship here, as well as the deep and quiet faith of so many of you.

It must be the Lord's timing that I'm writing to you on the eve of one of two of our patron's feast days. St. Peter has a feast day in January that commemorates his great confession of faith in Jesus ("You are the Christ, the Son of the living God"), but his regular feast day in June is celebrated along with the other great apostle, St. Paul.

What a contrast these two men are! Peter was a fisherman with rough hands and impulsive speech. He failed Christ in his hour of greatest need, second only to Judas in the depth of his betrayal. And yet, Peter — forgiven by Jesus and empowered by the Holy Spirit — stood on the day of Pentecost and fearlessly proclaimed the resurrection, ushering thousands into the kingdom.

By contrast, Paul was a cultured Pharisee trained in Hebrew Scriptures and Greek rhetoric. He, too, failed the Messiah sent by the God he claimed to serve, breathing threats and murder against Jesus-followers until his own dramatic conversation to become a disciple himself. This former enemy of the cross spent the rest of his life traveling the ancient world, planting churches and bringing thousands more to saving faith.

Our world has such deep — seemingly impossible — divisions. We see human failure in the church and outside of it. But the feast of St. Peter and St. Paul reminds us that God's grace never fails. And, people from vastly different walks of life can be transformed and used to do great things for the kingdom, no matter the odds. "If God is for us, who can be against us?" (Romans 8:31).

St. Peter's has gone through a time of change, and the changes in the church and in our world continue. But we know the One who is faithful. The Lord will bring us through these changes, together, and our eyes will see his wonders along the way.

The Center is funded by public assistance, private grants and individual donations, and relies heavily on volunteers. The writer of Hebrews 3:13 tells us to encourage one another, do not go it alone. We often buy into cultural individualism instead of following the way of the savior which is always relational. The Trinity itself models for us the importance of community and shares the value of relating well.

We hope this retreat will help you become more aware of the spirit's leading, give you the opportunity to be encouraged and to encourage others through sharing the stories God is telling through your life, and we hope you will come to find joy in your journey. Our desire is for this retreat to help give you a new vitality to go back into your life having encountered a God that chases after you and a God who wants you to continue on your faith journey in order to be formed to be more like His son, Jesus.

Father John Scott performed both services at 8:30 and 10:30. The prior week we performed all our traditional services including Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday. Thank you for all those who had a hand into this year's preparation during the Lenten and Easter services this year. With so much uncertainty, in regards to supply ministry and last minute decisions, the services were beautiful and brought back some sense of normalcy. Thank you all so much for all your help.

I briefly have had some discussions with Mother Christina regarding their move to Albany. They will be arriving in mid to late June, and will be celebrating 10:30 service with us beginning on July 3^{rd} . Mother Christina and her family are very excited to get to Albany and begin worshiping with all of us, as many of us here are excited as well.

Finance – G. Scala - Treasurer's Report

In George's absence the Treasurer's Report for April was reviewed. Offerings for the month of April were \$14,751 and Year-to-date we are at \$47,392. This compares to \$55,557 for 2021. Investment accounts saw significant declines for the month. Merrill Lynch was down -7.61% for the month and Key was down -7.42%. Year-to-date Merrill Lynch has a return of -14.60% and Key is at -14.76%. Expenses were \$43,785 under budget year-to-date through April.

We have received 27 pledges for 2022 for a total of \$104,730.
