Beloved of God,

Get ready. It's about to get interesting.

This month, we enter the church season of surprises -- the time God opens our eyes to a deeper vision of who God is. This is Epiphany.

We know that when someone says, "I just had an epiphany!" they're describing an intense insight that they didn't have beforehand. But the original meaning of Epiphany is a "revealing." The Christian feast of the Epiphany celebrates the revealing of Christ to the first Gentiles (the wise men) and the season after Epiphany ends, right before Lent, with the Transfiguration.

Epiphanies matter here at St. Peter's. Our leaflet, for many, many years, has had the words of an epiphany emblazoned on the cover. Can you remember what it says without looking? We'll come back to that.

The reason epiphanies matter at St. Peter's is that Peter – our patron – became famous for an epiphany of Jesus that he had. Peter said, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." God the Father gave this special insight to Peter, and Peter truly saw Jesus for who he was. There is an entire church feast dedicated to this moment known as The Confession of St. Peter the Apostle that we'll celebrate on Sunday, January 22nd (and there will be a special surprise at the 10:30 service, so I hope you'll be able to attend worship that day).

But, this brings us back to the words of the epiphany that are printed on our leaflet cover. Do you remember them yet? Here they are: "Thou art Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it."

The epiphany printed on our leaflet's the proclamation of Jesus, spoken to Peter. And, those words are the key to understanding any true Epiphany of God: When we see Jesus for who he is, Jesus helps us understand who we truly are, in him. When Peter saw Jesus as the Christ, it was then that Jesus could help Peter understand his high and holy calling of leadership among the disciples, to take up a faith that would crush the gates of hell.

As a church, we're in a season of discerning. We need to hear Jesus speak the epiphany he has for us, as a congregation, in 2023. We need to hear who we are. And, we need the compassionate and holy eyes of Jesus to see the people all around us who we are called to serve in his name.

Our Lord Jesus wishes to speak to us. Let us then enter this Epiphany season, brothers and sisters, with the expectation of hearing his voice. May we see ourselves, in him. May we see our neighbors, in him.

And most of all, may we ever more clearly see his glory.

The Vestry Nominating Committee is at work to present a slate of candidates to the parish to be elected for open seats on the Vestry. Here are the candidates so far:

Names to be considered for the ballot must be submitted to the church office in writing by Wednesday, January 18th. Additional nominations may be made during the Annual Meeting from the floor, assuming the nominee is present and accepts the nomination.

#### ONLINE AND IN-PERSON BIBLE STUDY BEGINNING IN JANUARY

#### Tunes of Glory: The Biblical Canticles.

In this study we will read and discuss the four great New Testament hymns found in St. Luke's Gospel: The songs of Mary, Zechariah and Simeon and the Gloria, sung by the Angels to announce the birth of Christ. Having been set to music countless times, these biblical songs remain an integral part of worship for Christians around the world, especially in the Anglican tradition. The Songs of Mary and Simeon are part of Evening Prayer and the Song of Zechariah is frequently sung at Morning Prayer, and the Gloria forms the basis of the Gloria sung at nearly every Sunday Eucharist. Over the course of four sessions we will read the Canticles in depth, considering them both as poetry and as sacred scripture. Each session will last approximately 45 minutes and will be offered in person on Sunday mornings and a second time by Zoom on Tuesday evenings at 7:30 pm.



#### Approval of the Vestry Meeting Minutes, October 11th, 2022

The vestry minutes from the October 11<sup>th</sup> meeting were approved on a motion by D. Spath, seconded by F. Hershey, then unanimously approved by the vestry.

#### Priest in Charge Report - Mtr. Christina

#### **Rector stuff:**

Nathan and Solomon Douglas received first communion on All Saints' Sunday.

Morris Bonds has been prepared for Holy Baptism. A service date is pending.

Did two home visits last month.

Led a graveside service for Agnes Beverley on Oct. 28

Attended part of the Diocesan priest retreat last week at Christ the King Spiritual Life Center.

The "St. Peter's Stories" preaching series concluded on All Saints' Sunday. The final video in the series will be posted on youtube this week.

Moses Kamya has stepped down as head usher after over 15 years of service (he will remain in the usher guild). Jeff Russom has agreed to serve as head usher for at least the next year. He has drafted an updated set of usher instructions, and we're collaborating on a final draft.

Stewardship letter was written and sent out.

Funeral Policy updated, including fee schedule (see handout).

Working on "punch list" for welcoming ideas needed to be completed by Christmastide

#### Interim stuff:

Review: My job as interim involves essentially two duties: My first duty is do "big picture" vision/mission work with the whole congregation that answers three questions: Who are we? Who is our neighbor? What is God calling us to do? The second duty is to review ministries, systems, policies, etc, and see if anything needs to be updated, cleaned out, done away with, or highlighted/celebrated.

Update on the "Who are we?" piece of my interim work:

We collected some great St. Peter's stories from parishioners in the last couple of months. Some were told to me personally, some were written in the "take home kits," and some were told at the Storytelling Sunday/Chili Cookoff on October 16.

The St. Peter's timeline is complete and posted between the church and Pumpelly Room.

I'm praying about/working with my interim ministry mentor on what next steps might be helpful for St. Peter's to continue "Who are we?" work and to begin considering question two: "Who is my neighbor?'

#### Sr. Warden's Report -J. Chenot

I would like to begin my November report by thanking Mother Christina for taking up the task of diving deeply into our past history and incorporating her findings in her weekly "Story Telling" sermons. Mother Christina has been working hard not to miss any small details on services and events, getting accustomed to our annual traditions. Also, Mother Christiana's Story telling/chili cook off was a great success.

Our office begins to get busy this time of year. Over and above the weekly preparations Ruth and Janice work on each week. Janice Chenot has been getting things ready for the pre-Thanksgiving event. The Turkeys have been purchased and ready for those interested in cooking them at home. Many thanks to Wayne and Pat juggling all the extra work needed before hand to set up for these special events. They also have everything set for this upcoming winter's snow season. Thank you both for all your work and preparation.

Coming up as mentioned, the pre-Thanksgiving dinner will be this Saturday. We are preparing and looking forward to our upcoming events in December. Starting off with the Messiah Sing along on December 11<sup>th</sup>, including full orchestra. The concert will be in honor of our dear choir director Neil Keen. Neil's wife Mary, our interim choir director has been working tirelessly rehearsing with our choir. The choir is sounding fabulous, thank you all for all your hard work and dedication. Please note the choir is always looking for and recruiting new members to join our choir – spread the word.

We will begin the 10:30 service on Sunday, December 11th, with our Sunday School Christmas Pageant. The following Sunday December 18th at the 10:30 service, we will have Lessons and Carols, followed by our annual greening in the church, "The Hanging of the Greens" event, including a luncheon. We hope that many will attend this great ministry and fellowship, it is a great time for all. We will move forward from there preparing for our Christmas Eve Services we all look forward to. God Bless you all and thank you for all your dedication and incredible work.

**Sunday Attendance** – The Average Sunday Attendance is 69.7.

#### Finance - G. Scala - Treasurer's Report

George reviewed the Treasurer's Report for October. Offerings for the month of October were \$10,526 and Year-to-date we are at \$142,811. This compares to \$150,846 for 2021. Investment accounts saw positive returns for the month. Merrill Lynch was up +5.53% for the month and Key was up +3.64%. Year-to-date Merrill Lynch has a return of -19.16% and Key is at -23.12%. Expenses were \$97,431 under budget year-to-date through October.

We remain at 27 pledges for 2022 for a total of \$104,730. Mother Christina will be sending out a Stewardship letter soon. Respectfully Submitted,

<u>Property</u> – There has been a to-do list that is slowly being worked through at the Rectory including repairs to the kitchen ceiling, smoke alarms installed, fall cleanup and tree removal, as well as getting a quote for gutters.

In the guild house, we will be having the phone system replaced, we are looking to replace the carpet in the office in the Spring, and fixes to the 4<sup>th</sup> floor apartment are being worked on.

#### Outreach - S. Debonis

The Outreach Committee had its November meeting on Sunday, November 6, and has begun thinking about Christmas. There will be a giving tree in the Pumpelly Room again this year, with an emphasis on board games and similar family activities as requested gifts. Janice will organize that, along with Ruth. Sharon was asked to contact the Damien Center to find out if there's anything we can help with for the holidays. Laura continues her year-round work at the soup kitchen and the Children's Café. There is a box for food donations for the soup kitchen at the back of the church; Laura will deliver any donations. There is also a basket there for donations of new or gently used coats and other outerwear, in all sizes.

The Committee was able to secure a commitment for 330 single-use containers each month, for use in the soup kitchen for individual meals. We are very grateful to the family who facilitated this significant gift. An anonymous donor has also given \$5,000 to the soup kitchen as a direct result of learning about the project from our director of outreach, Laura Saffares Rulison.

<u>Old Business</u> – After much research, Mother Christina has come across what we believe to be the second altar of St. Peter's Church. The vestry has had many discussions about where we think this altar should be placed, and after much consideration it has been decided that it will serve our youth in a space that will be repurposed for Children's Chapel. More to come on this in the near future.

New Business – The annual meeting and Vestry nominations will be coming soon. The vestry has begun discussing where the openings will be as well as potential nominations.

The Vestry will be sending out a postcard to neighboring areas to encourage new members for our Advent Season.

#### Adjournment

A motion to adjourn was made by M. Lundberg and seconded by A. Closson, then was approved unanimously by the vestry. Compline was led by Mtr. Christina.


